Find a pebble with an unusual pattern and draw it below

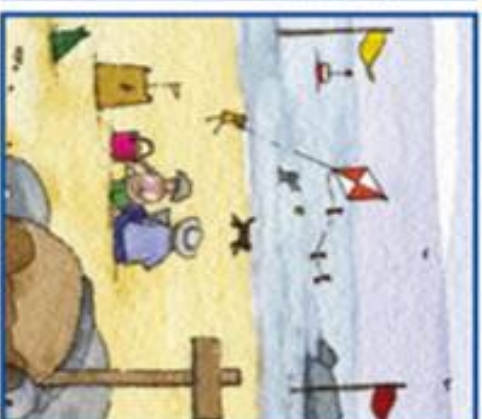
KEEP YOURSELF AND THE ENVIRONMENT SAFE

- Never take live animals home, they can only live in the sea.
- Don't collect animals and keep them in a bucket.
- They may eat each other or die from lack of oxygen.
- Always take your litter home, it is not only unsightly, but it can also kill or injure wildlife.

THE BEACH AND SEA CAN BE GREAT FUN BUT CAN ALSO BE DANGEROUS!

- Take care when bathing and swimming
- Never go in the sea on your own
- Find the red and yellow flags and swim between them
- Never swim when a red warning flag is flying
- Never swim where a sign says not to, such as near rocks or piers
- Keep away from the sea when it is rough
- Rocks can be sharp and slippery
- Don't touch strange objects
- Beware of rusty tins, broken glass and fishing tackle
- If you see someone in trouble, tell a life guard or dial 999
